Craig would like to scale back the size of the tickets this year, which should help with cost of printing, etc.

Jim Mowder has the paperwork to renew our annual sponsorship on a flowerbed at Ward-Meade. It is \$100 and allows us to have TAWGS name on it. Don Taliaferro made a motion to approve the renewal and Don Reiger seconded the motion. Motion Craig had met with Phil Thompson regarding

upgrades that need to be done to the website. Phil was hoping to get approval for \$100 to buy a Yoo Theme Pro subscription which would give us access to themes, their widget kit and support. His goals are to:

TIPS

Goldfish and koi normally spawn in the warming water of spring. If you want to help ensure survival of some of the baby fish, provide a place for the eggs as well as fry (baby fish) to hide from the larger fish. This can be the roots of plants like Water Hyacinth, or a soft filter material. Caution: too many fish can lead to poor water quality.

Check Your Water

Many of us have had a very dry winter this year. That means that we have had a great deal of evaporation and have been topping off our ponds more. This warrants mention of the importance of dechlorinating tap water. You should always add dechlorinator (Dry or Liquid) when topping off the water level of a pond. Any amount of chlorine (such as that found in treated water) can be harmful to your fish. Even if it is not enough chlorine to mean immediate death of the fish, this chlorine can still cause harm to proper gill function.
